This role will be offered on a 4 years' fixed term contract basis, subject to availability of funding. You will be based in GAIN's Tanzania office in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

The Food System Governance Associate will also undertake various administrative tasks such as meetings coordination with team members and various stakeholders.
