

1. EIT SUPERVISOR

Location: Tanzania

Job Description

MISSION AND JOB DIMENSION:

- The Construction Supervisor EIT (Electrical, Instrument and Telecommunications Systems) is responsible supervising the day-to-day construction activities of the EPcmC staff & CONTRACTORs for the installation and commissioning of electrical, instrumentation, telecom's infrastructure, and security systems within the AGI, MST facilities and along the pipeline.
- They will ensure the work is carried out using safe working practices and is completed in accordance with the project codes, standards, drawings, and specifications.
- The EITS Supervisor will be responsible for the supervision of the EITS construction team across the package work scopes allocated to their areas.

ACTIVITIES:

- To supervise the EITS scopes within the allocated LOTs of the Pipeline, AGI, and MST area packages
- To support and promote on-the-job training and coaching to local content personnel, liaising either directly or indirectly with training providers to ensure training is provided and performance monitoring of such.
- Directly supporting the EPcmC staff & the CONTRACTORs ensuring delivery of the Pipeline and associated AGI, MST facilities and EITS infrastructure are on-time and to budget.
- Implement, use, and communicate safe work practices on and off the project sites
- Co-ordinating Daily Reporting requirements for the EITS Installations

- Participate in the review of project schedules with the Project Management team
- Ensuring CONTRACTORS, local partners and local contractors receive and understand instructions and guidance enabling them to execute their obligations and deliverables as per the contract scopes.
- Identify conflicts in construction interfaces and communicate them to project team for resolution
- Conduct regular inspections of the works in progress to ensure conformance and build integrity
- Providing instruction and supervision to junior field engineers on day-to-day work scope execution
- Participate in constructability and technical design reviews to identify any opportunities for optimisation to improve construction execution efforts and delivery
- Interface with project preservation team to ensure EITS modules, skids and equipment are being correctly stored and monitored for preservation integrity
- Interface with AGI, Pipeline and MST Superintendents to ensure the delineation of battery limit scopes are clearly communicated and understood by all stakeholders.
- monitor SAT's and ensure the test reports are verified and endorsed by the relevant authorities/SME
- Monitoring of ITP inspection surveillance and hold points by the designated personnel.
- coordination of system and subsystem completion for testing and commissioning readiness
- Work within a multi-cultural business framework and provide ethical and compliant support.
- Mentor exemplary behaviour regarding HSE, Ethics and Company "Code of Conduct" policy.

CONTEXT AND ENVIRONMENT:

- The EACOP project includes a 1445km 24in oil export pipeline, 8 above ground facilities and a series of main line block valves and trace heating stations, and a green field marine terminal with an export jetty. 150km of feeder lines from Upstream facilities will tie-in to the EACOP project. The EACOP Project will be the largest privately led with Government participation transnational infrastructure project ever undertaken in East African region. The project overall tonnage is estimated at 500,000t of material and equipment.
- Behind the numerous technical (the longest electrically heat traced pipeline in the world), environmental and social challenges faced by the project, the Governments of

Uganda and Tanzania agreed to develop EACOP in a fast-track mode. The project is aims for a Ready for Start-up (RFSU) schedule 39 months after FID.

- The Project context is complex with numerous Contractor and Package Manager interfaces within the Integrated Project Team, three partners, development in two countries new to oil development (Uganda and Tanzania), and the need for project development in accordance external financing requirements.
- The field-based positions are located at Contractor Accommodation camp & offices at Contractor Main Camp and Pipe yard locations in Tanzania. Position is on an 8x2 rotation, 6 workdays per week, 10-hour workdays involving routine monitoring at Contractor work sites within the area of responsibility.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

- Ensure compliance with Tanzanian rules, regulations, shareholder and governmental agreements, and standards relevant to project activities and project implementation in compliance with requirements in construction deliverables and site activities.
- Ensure compliance with project requirements and regulatory frame in pipeline construction related activities.
- Supporting and coordination EACOP project teams processes.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCES REQUIRED:

- Degree qualification (BS) in electrical/instrumentation/telecom's engineering or other Company agreed applicable discipline qualifications that support the construction management, execution, and commissioning of the EITS scopes within the onshore pipeline and related AGI and MST facilities packages
- A minimum of 8 years of E&I construction experience working in the Oil & Gas sectors.
- 5 years of E&I experience working within a cross-functional oil & gas pipeline project team supporting; electrical engineering, interface, construction, completions, and commissioning readiness.
- Experience working with and analysing construction data to create accurate reporting KPI's and progress status back to the project management team

MISSIONS / JOB DIMENSIONS:

* The East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) project is a major regional infrastructure project (Capex: 3.6 G\$, OPEX:>2.5G\$ over 25 years) between Uganda and Tanzania coast, opening a new value corridor between the two countries. The EACOP project development comprises of the detailed engineering, construction, operation and maintenance of the corresponding facilities.

* Uganda & Tanzania regulations emphasizes the national/local content expectations and requirements from both governments. In both countries, national/local content requirements are articulated around three main poles:

- 1. Employment & training of Ugandan/Tanzanian citizens to ensure minimum percentages of national citizens along HR organization (EACOP and contractors),
- Procurement of local goods & services with some reserved contracts for Ugandan/Tanzanian parties (e.g. transportation, security, fuel supply, land surveying, civil works, etc.) and advertising bidding process to allow local suppliers to compete,
- 3. Proposal for technology transfer & capacity building in order to promote sustainable economic development and national industrialization. National/local content obligations are embedded in call for tenders and are part of evaluation criteria of the main contractors (TIER 1).

* The main missions of the job holder are:

- Lead the "Contract operations" required to achieve EACOP's project Local Content Plan objectives, in line with Local Content regulatory requirements.
- Related topics: Contract & procurement I Local supply chain development / Local Content / In Country Value.

* The Job holder will perform its activities for both National Content In Uganda and Local Content in Tanzania

* The job holder shall undertake all activities she/he is responsible for, or involved in, with the highest level of consideration for HSE risk management, protecting human health, respecting communities and conserving the environment.

* She/he will promote safety and environment awareness / conscientiousness at all levels through an exemplary and pro-active attitude towards the Project team, the Contractor / Subcontractor / Vendor Team and with all stakeholders.

- Assist as required the EACOP local content manager (preparing reports, drafting presentations and/or communications.

CONTEXT AND ENVIRONMENT:

* The EACOP project includes a 1445km 24in oil export pipeline, 8 above ground facilities, a green field marine terminal with an export jetty and a series of 60 main line block valves and +20 trace heating stations. 150km of feeder lines from Upstream facilities will tie-in to the EACOP project. The Pipeline project will be the largest privately led with Government participation transnational infrastructure project ever undertaken in East African region. The project overall tonnage is estimated at 500,000t of material and equipment;

* Behind the numerous technical (the longest electrically heat traced pipeline in the world), environmental and social challenges faced by the project, Government of Uganda and Government of Tanzania agreed to develop EACOP project in a fast track mode. The project is aiming at a Ready For Start-up (RFSU) schedule not later than 39 months after FID.

* The context is complex with numerous stakeholders, environmental and societal / local content stakes, three partners, two involved countries new to oil development (Uganda and

Tanzania), and the need for project development in accordance with IFC standards to secure the necessary financing.

* In the current context of low oil price the project needs to be developed with low CAPEX & OPEX to support the development economics and enable FID while maintaining the technical quality of the installations, with high H3SE requirements and focus.

* The Local Content Contracts strategy Lead will have to take into account the following context and environment in his activities.

- Local Content development is key for both country's development, to satisfy Authorities and local communities' expectations, Total code of conducts and consequently for EACOP, its social license to build and operate.
- Project status close to FiD implying fast growing in-country activities.
- Lack of detailed information on Tanzania and Uganda industrial capabilities Fast changing environment

* Job Location : The position is based in Dar Es Salam (Tanzania) with potential trips to and

contacts with TEPU offices Uganda.

ACCOUNTABILITIES:

- Accountable to implement, secure and monitor EACOP's Local Content commitments through efficient C&P documents, process, coordination and communication, in line with Tanzanian Local Content regulations, with EACOP's C&P manager, LC Manager and Local Content requirements and recommendations.
- Develop good working relations and cooperation, with the latter, with "Capacity Building lead" to align local content requirements with project capacity building plan, and with "Local industrialization support officer", to challenge bidders, contractors and subcontractors local content proposals and contribution.
